### HOMEGROUPS at HOLY SAVIOUR

Homegroups are a vital part of the life of Holy Saviour. They are a place for fellowship, and pastoral support, learning and growth. Group members share with and pray for one another. # THIS TERM'S THEME - THE NICENE CREED

What we believe and why

This year marks 1700<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Nicene Creed, which we use at many of our services. It's a creed used by Orthodox Christians in the East as well as Roman Catholic and Protestant Christians around the world and still expresses the faith we hold in common. Its content is being appreciated by Christians in newer churches as well as those who have used it every week for many years. It emerged from the Council of Nicaea in 325, a meeting called by the Emperor Constantine, at which Christian leaders from around the known world met to address the challenge of false teaching which was dividing the church and was added to in later years.

This term most of our homegroups will be looking at this Creed. Why does it say what it does? What were the false ideas it was combating? What were the truths it was upholding? How does it reflect the teaching in the Bible? Do these things matter today? What are the challenges to our understanding of the faith today? How can we respond to its teaching? For 1700 years Its statements of faith have stood the test of time and are needed as much now as in the past, to deepen our relationship to God and the hope and confidence which flows from that.
